LESSON OUTLINE

THE MESSAGES OF JESUS Luke 4:14-15, 16-30, 31, 42-44

- A.In a Nazareth synagogue (4:16-30): Jesus preaches a sermon in his hometown.
 - 1. The contents of his sermon (4:16-27)
 - a) What he reads (4:16-19): He reads from Isaiah 61, where the prophet describes the supernatural ministry of the Messiah.

LESSON OUTLINE

- b) What he says (4:20-27)
 - ► The identification (4:20-23): Jesus says he is the Messiah Isaiah wrote about!
 - The illustrations (4:24-27): Jesus gives two Old Testament examples to illustrate why he cannot perform the miracles in Nazareth that he has elsewhere-namely, because of the people's unbelief!
 - The example of Elijah and the Zarephath widow (4:24-26)
 - The example of Elisha and the leper Naaman (4:27)
- 1. The contempt for his sermon (4:28-30): Jesus' remarks so infuriate the audience that they actually attempt to kill him!
