

## JOSEPH, THE FORGIVING SAINT

Genesis 42:1-48:22

#### LESSON OUTLINE JOSEPH AND HIS BROTHERS – Genesis 42:1-45:28

- The unknown brother (42:1-44:34)
- First trip of Jacob's sons to Egypt (42:1-38)

#### LESSON OUTLINE

- 1) <u>The reason</u> (42:1-6): Jacob tells his ten oldest sons, "I have heard there is grain in Egypt. Go down and buy some for us before we all starve to death."
- 2) <u>The recognition</u> (42:7-8): Joseph recognizes his brothers, but they do not recognize him.
- 3) <u>The rebuke</u> (42:9-14): Attempting to make them squirm, Joseph accuses his brothers of being spies, which they deny.
- 4) The requirement (42:15-20): Joseph demands that his brothers return home and bring back Benjamin, the youngest brother. Simeon is kept as a guarantee that they will return.

#### LESSON OUTLINE

- 5) <u>The remorse</u> (42:21-23): The guilt-stricken brothers conclude that God is punishing them for selling Joseph into slavery.
- 6) The restraint (42:24): Upon hearing this, Joseph leaves the room so that he does not reveal his true identity as he weeps.
- 7) <u>The return</u> (42:25-28): The nine brothers arrive in Canaan with their food. As they unpack, they are astounded to discover in their bags the money they had used to buy the food!
- 8) <u>The review</u> (42:29-38): Jacob's sons tell him all about their first trip, including how "the man" (Joseph) has requested that Benjamin accompany them on their return journey. Jacob refuses.

#### LESSON NUGGETS

God has a plan.

God wants to give you so much more if you can pass the test.

Focus on God and not revenge.

# CONCLUSION The Importance of Tears

Joseph had settled into life in Egypt, secure in his powerful position. He had married and started a family. He had taken over the responsibility of providing grain for those who had traveled from near and far to Egypt because of the severe famine that had ravaged many countries. It was business as usual for Joseph until he looked up and saw a group of 10 men dressed like he used to be when he lived in Canaan. And then he realized—these were his brothers! They too had come to Egypt to buy grain.

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# CONCLUSION The Importance of Tears

That Joseph's motives for acting as he did toward his brothers were not rooted in selfishness or vindictiveness is seen most of all in his tears. He could not control his emotions when he learned that Reuben had actually intended to spare his life. Though the brothers did not know it, the governor of Egypt was already planning how to see his father again and keep his whole family safe.
